INTERFAITH POTLUCK AND SPECIAL GUEST SPEAKER

On Sunday evening, February 4th there will be an interfaith potluck. We gather with our friends and neighbours from other faiths, bring some food to share, and get to know one another informally.

After the meal there will be a guest speaker, Dr. Wayne Horowitz, who is an international scholar, will speak to us. He is a Professor of Assyriology at the Institute of Archaeology at Hebrew University in Jerusalem. His research focuses mainly on the religions and traditions of the Ancient Near East thousands of years ago, but an ancient drawing of the Babylonian Moon has brought him in recent years to Northern Canada and Alaska. Professor Horowitz is back in Whitehorse this February to speak about his research and experiences.

The Feast of the Boy in the Moon: A New Look at a Traditional Gwich’in Festival of the Boy in the Moon.

The Gwich’in narrative of ‘The Boy in the Moon’, a story of Man and the Caribou migrations, survives the stories and memories of the Gwich’in First Nation in the Yukon, NWT, and Alaska. For the past five years, the Gwich’in Ethno-Astronomy project of the Gwich’in Tribal Council, Department of Cultural Heritage of the NWT have been speaking with tribal elders and collecting written evidence documenting the Boy in the Moon tradition throughout the North. Professor Horowitz will present an update into this research focusing on rites and rituals relating to the Boy in the Moon.

Are there ways to help one another be safe and supported? For example,

- whom would you call if you needed serious help?
- who here knows where your important papers are?
- who will notice if you are ill?
- who will contact your family away in case of emergency?
- who will serve as local contact for your family?

Twenty-three people came to our original meetings last Spring. Of that group seventeen have joined one of three subgroups (“pods”). Each pod serves as “family” for the members of the pod, with information being shared and responsibilities taken as the particular pod decides. We expect to meet Thursday, January 18 at 2 PM (Whitehorse United Church) to form more pods.
